

Glaciar Calluqueo

The Calluqueo Glacier is a beautiful thousand-year-old mass of ice that descends along the western slope of Mount San Lorenzo. At its base, it has a beautiful grey-colored mountain lake resulting from the large amount of sediment carried by the waters from the top of the hill. It is surrounded by pristine forests inhabited by huemules (South Andean deer) and where condors fly over.



Itinerary:

Time	Description
08:30 hrs.	Departure from Parador Loberías del Sur Puerto Bertrand or similar
09:00 hrs.	Confluence of the Baker River with the Neff River
11:00 hrs.	Visit Cochrane Main Square with free time
11:30 hrs.	Continue trip to Monte San Lorenzo / Calluqueo Glacier
12:30 hrs.	Arrival at Calluqueo Glacier viewpoint; food service
13:30 hrs.	Navigation and approach to the base of the glacier (subject to weather conditions)
15:30 hrs.	Departure from viewpoint, return to Route 7
18:00 hrs.	Arrival at Parador Loberías del Sur or similar.
20:00 hrs.	Dinner included

- Snack in the morning, box lunch, snack in the afternoon
- Bilingual guides during the whole excursion
- Navigation to the glacier, subject to weather conditions
