

Glaciar Calluqueo

ITINERARY IS PART OF PROGRAMS TO MARBLE CHAPELS

The Calluqueo Glacier is a beautiful millenary mass of ice that descends along the western slope of Mount San Lorenzo. At its base, it has a beautiful lead-colored mountain lake resulting from the large amount of sediment carried by the waters from the top of the hill. It is surrounded by pristine forests inhabited by huemules (South Andean deer) and where condors fly over.



Itinerary:

Time	Description
08:00 hrs.	Departure from Parador Loberías del Sur Puerto Bertrand or similar
10:30 hrs.	Arrival at the Calluqueo Glacier viewpoint
11:30 hrs.	Departure from the viewpoint, return to the Austral Highway
13:00 hrs.	Visit to the main square of Cochrane with free time
14:00 hrs.	Visit to Patagonia Park
17:00 hrs.	Confluence of the Baker River with the Neff River
18:00 hrs.	Arrival at Parador Loberías del Sur or similar.
20:00 hrs.	Dinner included (without beverages)
